



 - 443 of those grades were either D's or F's, which is 4%
- Total Middle School enrollment
 = 2,041
 - 260 of those students were given either a D and/or F, which is 13%

Q2: Initial Findings-High School Grades

- 18,624 grades that were given
 - 1,077 of those grades were either D's or F's, which is 6%
- Total High School enrollment = 3,099
 - 547 of those students were given at least one D and/or F, which is 18%



Areas of Growth:

- We have a high Chronic Absenteeism rate of 31%
- Chronic absenteeism numbers have gone up even compared to last year
- Elementary grade levels show the biggest jumps in chronic absenteeism
- Subgroups with highest chronic absenteeism
 - Students with Disabilities (38.4%)
 - Latinx/Hispanic (38.7%)
 - Socio-Economically Disadvantaged (37.0%)
 - Native American (33.3%)
 - African American/Black (30.9%)
 - English Learners (30.7%)

Q2: Initial Findings- Discipline

- 95 suspensions from August 18, 2022-December 16, 2022
 - 13 of those students have been suspended 2 or more times (14%)
- Main Reasons for Suspensions (77%)
 - Possession of a controlled substance (37%)
 - Caused attempted or threatened physical injury (22%)
 - Willful use of force, except in self defense (18%)
- Subgroups with the highest suspension rates
 - White (48%)
 - Latinx/Hispanic (31%)
 - Students with Disabilities (23%)
 - African American/Black (18%)



- Teachers provide students targeted small group instruction during the instructional day in identified area of need (Tier II instruction)
- Provide ongoing access to after school personalized learning opportunities to 1st - 8th grade Tier III SED, EL and BIPOC students in ELA, Math, or Science
- Maintain partnership with InnovateEd to support Principals and School Leadership Teams to create greater clarity on student learning priorities, cultivate shared accountability and collaboration; strengthen instructional coherence, and engage in robust cycles of inquiry that focus on equitable student outcomes

Q2: Promising Staff Practices

- Provide targeted professional development on Cognitively Guided Instruction to strengthen first instruction (Tier I) and target ELs in developing mathematical concepts and academic language
- Provide expanded Social Emotional and Mental-Health supports to students to create the conditions for them to succeed academically
- Maintain current focus on integration of the Social Justice standards in our curriculum guides, expansion of Project Based Learning and the implementation of Restorative Justice and Social Emotional Learning
- Targeted outreach to families to provide wrap around services and address barriers impacting student attendance and engagement
- Implementation of Restorative Justice strategies and/or Responsive Classroom practices



















9th Grade ELA Focus IAB: Language and Vocabulary Use










District Wide Participation Rates for Fall Math Interim Assessment


Chronic Absenteeism




