Who is Amanda Gorman?

Amanda Gorman is our National Youth Poet Laureate. What is a poet laureate, you might ask? According to Wikipedia, a poet laureate is a poet officially appointed by a government or conferring institution typically expected to compose poems for special events and occasions. On January 20, 2021, Amanda Gorman read her poem "The Hill We Climb" at President Joe Biden's Inauguration Day. At 22 years old, she is the youngest poet laureate in history to read at an inauguration. Amanda also made history when she read her speech on the same day of Vice President Kamala Harris' Inauguration who is now our first woman Vice President and is the first woman of color to serve that position.

Amanda was born in Los Angeles and has two siblings. Amanda is a twin and was raised by her mom who was a teacher. She rarely watched TV growing up and thought of herself as a weird child because she enjoyed reading and writing. Amanda has a disorder where she is hypersensitive to sound and she went to speech therapy to get through it. At the age of 14, she became the first Los Angeles Youth Poet Laureate while she was in the WriteGirl program. She attended New Roads School right here in Santa Monica! Amanda graduated from Harvard University and is an award-winning writer. She has spoken at many historic events across the country. She has already written a poetry book called "The One for Whom Food Is Not Enough" in 2015 and she will be working on two children's books in the future. Did I mention she also wrote for black athletes for Nike?

She is truly unstoppable and so inspiring! You too can be like Amanda. Read more, write more and express yourself! I'll leave you with some of her words.

Lunar New Year: Another New Year?

Lastly, rules that you should/have to follow. What to do: set off fireworks (in many parts of China and others), eat dumplings (a popular tradition in Northern China), and clean your house, but BEFORE the Lunar New Year. What not to do: don’t wash or cut your hair,

clean on the first day of Lunar New Year or buy books (Spring Festival tradition).

Setting off fireworks: this is to ward off/scare evil spirits away! Eating dumplings: the Chinese word “jiao zi,” is similar to the ancient word for new replacing the old, it also looks like ancient times’ gold. If eaten it’ll bring fortune! Cleaning your house, before Lunar New Year: this is so that you can clean off all the bad luck that has come from the old year. Washing or cutting your hair, this is because cleaning or cutting your hair is thought to be cutting or washing your fortune away. Cleaning: this is because it will clean away the good luck (don’t even wash the dishes). If you want to clean, do it the second day. Buying books: this is because in Chinese the word “book” sounds like the word lose. You don’t want to have bad luck!


Among Us Game Review

In the last year it has been difficult for many of us to socialize with our friends. One game that makes this possible (and still allows you to follow social distancing protocols) is the game Among Us. Among Us is a popular murder-mystery game that came out three years ago. You can play this game on a computer, smart phone, tablet or a Nintendo Switch. What makes this a great option for you to play with your friends is that you need a maximum of 10 players and a minimum of 4. I would suggest at least 8 players for it to be really fun.

The game takes place in a spaceship. Before each game begins you are assigned a

little astronaut. In order to tell the difference between each astronaut, the astronaut's suits are different colors. These colors are chosen by each player. Inside Bill's Brain: Decoding Bill Gates, Part 1

I never expected that a documentary would make me happy to have a toilet. Let me explain:

In poor countries, many towns don't have pipes to remove bathroom waste, which is called sewage. The sewage ends up in rivers, which is also the place where people get their drinking water. As a re-

sult, many kids are becoming sick with diarrhea from the germs and parasites in the water. Half a million kids die from diarrhea.

The three part Netflix documentary, "Inside Bill's Brain" follows the Microsoft founder, Bill Gates, as he works on solutions to some of the world's biggest problems. Part One shows how in 2005, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation decided they wanted to do something about the sewage problems in poor countries. They held a competition to

find a toilet that could process the sewage and could reuse it to turn it into energy that powers the toilet. Many of the models were successful but way too expensive to build. Then he went to China to find companies that could build the new toilet cheaply, and it is now used in poor countries.

He also worked with an engineer who came up with an efficient sewage treatment factory that boiled the waste and turned it into steam, which powered the factory. The factory could also filter urine and turn it into clean drinking water. He built the factory in Dakar, Senegal, so that it could filter the waste and provide clean drinking water for many people that didn't have it before.

I recommend this documentary because it shows how lucky we are to have clean drinking water, bathrooms and sewage systems. And I'm really happy that people are trying to get these things into developing countries. I really enjoyed this documentary, and you probably will too.
