McKinley teachers completed the rigorous Common Sense certification process and earned McKinley our schoolwide Digital Common Sense Certification!




McKinley Earns 2018 Energy Star Certification



Adjusting to School

- During the first 2-3 weeks teachers teach routines, procedures, and expectations, and focus on building classroom community. There will be additional time spent and emphasis on social emotional learning, social skills, and building community.
- During the first 2-3 weeks teachers will conduct initial assessments to gather baseline data
- TK/K in particular will need time to build stamina and learn how to learn in-person



In-Person Safety Protocols and Procedures

Safety Protocols- Masks



- Masking Indoors and Outdoors (except when eating/drinking)
 - Families provide own masks; wash daily. If a child doesn't have a mask one will be provided. May pack extras in backpack.
- Benefits of Masks
 - Masks help protect our medically fragile students- working together to keep our McKinley family safe!
 - Students under 12 not vaccinated
 - Consistent messaging and routine
 - Successful last year with wearing masks consistently; may remove when eating

Safety Protocols- Distancing and Grouping



- Social distancing is no longer required, so classrooms will be setup in their traditional format for collaboration and interactive learning
- Stable grouping by classes
 - Yard zones for 1st-5th recess; TK/K stable grouped by grade level at recess
 - Eating by class and grade level
- When Eating unmasked
 - Lunch inside and outside the cafeteria
 - Additional tables purchased for outside
 - Grade levels will eat separately to maximize space
 - Not required but students will sit physically distanced while masks are removed for eating to maximize safety
 - Individually packaged lunches
 - Food free for all this year

Rainy Day/Heat Day Schedule

- No social distancing requirement
- Normal rainy day/heat day schedule
 - Recess in the classroom
 - Lunch- Both grade levels in the Caf, sitting with as much distance as possible
 - Lunch Recess- Movie in the auditorium
 - Modified PE in the auditorium or Room 100

Safety Protocols- Health



- Bottle filling stations
 - Mouth-spickets turned off at sinks
 - Bottle filling stations in all classrooms
 - Bottle filling stations located in outside locations
- Hand Sanitizing
 - Installed units in all rooms
 - Stands at gates
 - Staff with loose bottles
- Hand Washing
 - Time for Handwashing built in
 - Fully stocked restrooms
 - Sinks available in classrooms as well
 - Outside mini-sinks


Safety Protocols- Health



- Custodial Cleaning
 - Monitoring system to ensure regular cleaning
 - Cleaning sprays for different purposes
 - Regular safe cleaning spray in every classroom
- Full HVAC Ventilation System up to DPH Standards
 - Thermostat Fan set to on for circulation
 - Windows/doors open
 - Wall and ceiling fans turned off to reduce air blowing directly on people

Health Office

- Inside- basic triage, meds
- Outside- covid symptoms
- Nurse on-call and on campus part-time
- Health Office Specialist (HOS) full time

Visitor Policy

- PTA/Committee Meetings will be virtual
- Parent/teacher conference meetings may be in-person or virtual
- Volunteering temporarily on hold
- Some school events still to occur with covid-protocols in place



Mandated Staff Vaccination

- All eligible staff must be vaccinated
 - By August 19 all employees must report their covid vaccination status to HR; those who don't will be considered unvaccinated
 - By October 1st employees must be fully vaccinated and have submitted proof to HR
 - Unvaccinated employees will be excluded from campus and deemed absent without leave, unless a district-authorized exemption or accommodation obtained
- Employees with an exemption or accommodation must have 2 PCR tests a week; can only access campus if test is negative

Mandated Covid Testing



- Testing Currently
 - PCR Test and Enhanced Bio Test available at JAMS (results in 1 day)
 - Antigen testing at McKinley (15 min results)- appointments offered twice a week
 - Testing schedule and updates to be eblasted soon
- NEW- Screening Testing
 - Weekly PCR testing of all students and staff
 - Free and on-campus
 - Shallow (just cotton part of qtip in nose) self-administered test
 - Details about the implementation of testing TBD- Plan is for testing to be done by a vendor- Possibly at gates or scheduled by classroom
- NEW- Symptom Testing
 - Bio Fire PCR Test (farther up the nose) if student or staff displaying symptoms- rapid diagnose of several pathogens
 - Administered by Nurse

Quarantine Protocols



- Quarantine if exposed, illness symptoms, or positive test
 - Illness symptoms includes if student has a temperature at gate screening
- Quarantine is 10 days, but the length of time can be reduced to 7 days with a negative PCR covid test on day
 5, and asymptomatic or doctor's note explaining alternative diagnosis
- Individual quarantining:
 - Student work packet will be provided by teacher, and assignments given on digital platforms and software
 - O Please provide a 1-3 day grace period for student healing from illness and to prepare assignments. Packet can be picked up from the main office.
- Whole class quarantining:
 - Will have class with teacher on Zoom
- If an outbreak (3 or more positive cases in the school that are epidemiologically linked) LA County Department of Public Health makes a determination about school closure
- See the SMMUSD Covid Dashboard https://www.smmusd.org/Page/6297 for a live covid data sheet that shows number of cases and quarantines at each school site
- Note: No travel quarantine requirement- there is a recommendation, but not a requirement, that unvaccinated people travelling out of state quarantine for 10 days upon return, and get tested on day 5 to reduce the quarantine to 7 days.



Chromebook Checkout

- In case of quarantine, and to access our online resources (Digital Benchmark and MyMath curriculum, google classroom, Clever, Freckle etc.) please have a computer available at home for student learning.
- If you do not have a personal computer, please email <u>mrussell@smmusd.org</u> to checkout a school computer
- 1st-5th students from last year who checked out a Chromebook and/or Hotspot may continue to use it this year

Other Technology Reminders



- Uphold the Technology Use Agreement- technology used in a safe, responsible, proper manner in support of instruction.
- Please monitor your child's internet usage to ensure that the student does not engage in unauthorized online activities.
- Student use of district computers to access social networking sites is prohibited.
- School emails are also only to be used for school purposes (not chats or personal communication).
- McKinley is Digital Common Sense School Certified. Teachers will provide age-appropriate instruction regarding safe and appropriate behavior on technology devices.

Drop Off Procedures



- Students coming for breakfast may enter via the front office between 8:00am-8:15am.
- All gates open from 8:15am-8:30am.
- 1st-5th students may enter via the Arizona Garden, Arizona, or Parking Lot Gates. TK/K walking students may enter via the Chelsea Ave Gate.
- Adults may also utilize the Car Drop-Off system through the parking lot from 8:15-8:30am. Students being dropped off via car may enter via the Courtyard Gate (1st-5th) and TK/K Gate (TK/K).
- Gates are student-only access; adults say farewell to their child at the gate and students enter campus on their own.
- There is no play on the playground before school.
 Students will go directly to their class line up area and may socialize while waiting to be picked up by their teacher.
- Staff will be available on the yard to assist students and supervise.




Pre-Screening Website



- The old website BCHDcovidscreen.org was discontinued. New website is called Company Nurse. You will get an email to register.
- Before coming to school complete the pre-screening app
- Purpose is to stop and think before sending students to school
- Once answering the questions you get a green screen- come to school
- Once answering the questions you get a red screen- don't come to school;
 contact the school nurse
- Show the green screen at the gate as a "fast pass." If you forgot, there is a QR code at the gate, or student will be asked the questions by the gate monitor

Student Screening Process

Step 1: Check Temperature Step 2: Ask if Student Has

symptoms in the last 10 days:

1)Symptoms: Fever ≥ 100.4°F, shortness of breath, 1) Been within 6ft of someone with confirmed cough*, diarrhea/ vomiting. (difficulty breathing-call

*not from a documented chronic illness

2) Positive PCR COVID-19 test result

OR Currently

A Fever (≥100°F)

Had any COVID19 OR Been EXPOSED to a confirmed COVID19 case in the last 10 days

- COVID19 for a cumulative duration of 15minutes within a 24hr period with or without a mask.
- 2) Been in the same classroom (cohort) as someone with confirmed COVID19.
- 3) Had any unprotected contact with bodily fluids (saliva, mucous, blood, vomit, stool).
- Contacts of quarantined individuals (i.e. siblings) are not considered exposed and do not need to be guarantined.








Gate Entrance Line Ups




1st-5th Dots for Waiting Areas at Drop Off/Pick Up Gates











TK/K Lineup Areas

- At tables on the K playground by class
- Staff will be available to assist
- We may have some drawing and non-messy activities on the tables for students



Pick Up Procedures

- Staggered dismissal times
- Assigned gates by grade level
- Parents wait outside gates
- Teachers will dismiss students to their parent/guardian
- TK/K additional procedure- when parent arrives, gate monitors radio the name of student to the teacher, then student walks to meet their parent at the gate.
- We will be taking our time to maximize safetythank you for your patience
- There is not supervision between primary and upper dismissal; please arrange to pick up siblings at their dismissal time

Home Option Independent Study

Independent Study Option



- An option for 21-22 school year when in-person instruction would put the student at a health risk, as determined by the parent/guardian
- Does NOT replicate the Distance Learning experience last year or in-person learning; it is an Independent Study option. Students work primarily independently.
- Separate from the school:
 - Not part of McKinley, McKinley communications, offerings events etc.; a completely separate program students are enrolled in that is home only
 - Students across school sites
 - Grade level bands
 - District teacher
 - Administrator is Anthony Fuller <u>afuller@smmusd.org</u>
- The Independent Study option simply cannot replicate the in-person interactions, social-emotional learning, physical activity, instructional support and resources, and all the enrichment we offer (theater, PE, music, visual art, library, garden and more). So we really want our students to return unless they absolutely are unable to.
- Can return to in-person or go to ISP at the trimester (progress reports/report card time)- with 5 day notice
