Principal's Pen

Conference Week: It's Parent Conference and Book Fair week! We are looking for 100% parent/guardian participation. This is the most important parent event of the fall. At Back-to-School Night, 74.2 % of parents were able to join us. For parents who could not attend BTSN, it is imperative that you participate in conferences. Tell your child you are going and that their learning is of the utmost importance to you. Come back to your child with at least one thing to praise them about and at least one goal for improvement. Make sure your child is praised for their effort and understands his/her goal. Ultimately you want your child to know

that the adults in his/her life are working together to help your child. You want your child to understand that it is their effort that will carry them through academia and life. You want your child to always have goals. Thank you for your partnership.

Improved Departure Safety: As you have read repeatedly the past few months, the safe and quick arrival and departure of students has been a priority for Malibu Elementary. <u>The biggest concern has been departure</u>. We have been experiencing gridlock and traffic on the wrong side of the road on Fernhill. Students have even rushing out onto Fernhill to get into vehicles! We have been busy stopping this unsafe phenomena. <u>I have some good news about this</u>. The Facilities Department and I have been communicating with City staff and they have placed temporary signs along Fernhill Dr. that will match the signs on Grayfox to ensure that vehicles do not park from 7:30 - 8:30 AM MON-FRI , 2-3:00 PM MON-THUR AND 12-1 PM FRIDAY (SCHOOL DAYS). In addition, the temporary no parking signs extend right up to the Metro bus stop on Fernhill. The District will soon erect permanent signs, but in the meantime, the City has provided temporary signs. The change in signs coupled with parent volunteers should help significantly. We are now requesting that crosswalks be added to the Grayfox / Fernhill intersection. I want to thank the parents and neighbors who have joined our SSC is asking the City to help us out. It looks like MES is making progress! Now we just need volunteers for Grayfox after school. Please contact me to get involved. MES needs your help.

Facility Improvements: Beginning on November 8 and on the next few weekends our school will receive temporary landscape improvements. Sod will be laid down on the dirt BioClean berms near Fernhill, near the back of the Bungalows, and around the kindergarten yard. Irrigation heads will be replaced too. This work will precede summer work to replace the kindergarten and 1st - 5th play structures. These new play structures will have padding instead of sand, will be surrounded by artificial turf rather than dirt, and will offer the children fun climbing and musical activities. The kindergarten structure will be bordered by repurposed wood pilings from our own school and the new structure will come from Cabrillo. (It is in a box and was never installed there.) These moves are helping us stay within budget. In the end we will have cleaner, more colorful, more attractive, and modern play areas for our children. Once final architectural renderings are available, they will be shared in a future newsletter.

Thank you: Everyday I have scores of volunteers at the school to thank. This week I must publicly acknowledge the Room Parents, Zoe Langley, Melisa Solano, and Vidas Enck for putting together a wonderful Halloween and Dia de Los Muertos event for our children. With school closures, it was particularly dynamic but they pulled it off! Also many thanks to the Gerber Family for their significant cash donation to the Marine Science aquaria fund. New sea life will be rotating in and out of our aquariums! Lastly, thank you to all the families who were able to donate to Giving Week. Your warm generous support will serve our PTA in their effort to help our school thrive. So much of what is good about MES comes from volunteers and donors.

Safer Internet Skills for Parents, Parent Education Tuesday, December 10

Technology is a powerful tool for learning, communicating, and sharing. However, navigating it safely is not innate in children and it's up to us to teach them. Mrs. Jennings and Ms. Levy are leading Malibu Elementary to become a "Common Sense School" through the school-wide Digital Citizenship Program: Helping students take ownership of their digital lives.

The Common Sense Digital Citizenship Program addresses top concerns for parents and educators, prepares students to make smart choices online and in life, and engages the whole community through family outreach.

Our first family outreach night will be held December 10 at 4pm, right after the PTA meeting and just before the ELAC meeting. Come to the library and learn about media balance, digital footprint, identity and privacy, social relationships, bullying, communication, news and media literacy. We will also cover how technology is being used in the classroom for learning, communication, and collaboration.

Also, please tell your child to contact me or a staff member if they think there is a dangerous incident. This includes aggression on campus, stranger danger, or if someone talks about harassment or suicide. Your child's safety is of utmost importance to each of us. If your child cannot access me, have them write me a note and include their last name. I will get back to your child quickly.
