IV ELAC Discussion /Recommendation

The community liaison showed where to find the ELAC agendas and minutes in the Franklin Webpage and how to use the Santa Monica Public Library (Tumblebooks program)

Ms. Maura Zagor, Literacy and Language Interventionist, teaches a program called English 3D. The curriculum includes academic language frames, new vocabulary, discussion practice, writing of templates, and how to advocate for yourself. Home language is an asset and it is very important that students continue developing their home language.



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Parent: It would be nice if we can organize a class for English learners to have time to socialize and practice English, for newcomers, new students, English learners.

Answer: yes, we can ask Crest to create an after-school class. It could be a cooking or art class. We can also take that idea to DELAC, maybe the district can organize an after-school class.

For this class to happen at school, we need a teacher to sponsor a “club” (a class) in the after-school space. Alternatively, parents can organize a group with a common theme and meet, for example, once a month

Parent: Can I suggest you that we have an email group to contact all the ELAC parents?

Answer: Sure, we can create one.

**V DELAC Report:**

*All ELAC representatives from the Santa Monica-Malibu School District meet once a month in a meeting called DELAC. It is not mandatory but we ask our representative to attend if possible.
