awarded the English Literacy and Civics Grant (El Civic) from the Federal government in an amount of \$195,000. This grant expands English literacy services and promotes the development of integrated programs that incorporate English language and literacy instruction and civics education. English language learners must master English and be able to understand and navigate American institutions and systems, such as government, education, workplace, banking and health care. This initiative focuses on English language learners who function at or below Nation Adult Literacy Survey levels 1 and 2. The grant will supply equipment for a Gateway laptop lab, furniture, staff development, field trips and audio video equipment.

The District is ordering Gateway computers per Long Beach Unified's Bid #21-0001/14. Furthermore, during the Board meeting of February 9,1995, the Board of Education declared Gateway Computers a sole source vendor for computer equipment purchases.

### **RESOLUTION NUMBER 02-27**

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE SANTA MONICA - MALIBU UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF 2003-2004 TAX AND REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTES AND REQUESTING THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH NOTES BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections §53850 *et seq.*, of the Government Code of the State of California (the "Act") contained in Title 5, Division 2, Part I, Chapter 4, Article 7.6 thereof, on or after the first day of any fiscal year, the Santa Monica - Malibu Unified School District (the "District") may borrow money by issuing notes in anticipation of the receipt of taxes, income, revenue, cash receipts and other moneys to be received by the District attributable to its fiscal year ending June 30, 2004, for any purpose for which the District is authorized to expend moneys, including but not limited to current expenses, capital expenditures and the discharge of any obligation or indebtedness of the District; and

WHEREAS, Section §53853 of the Act provides that such notes may be issued by the appropriate County Board of Supervisors on behalf of the District upon the authority of a resolution of the governing board of the District; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Education (the "District Board"), being the governing board of the District, desires the assistance of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles (the "County Board") in the borrowing of not to exceed \$5,000,000 by the issuance of notes hereby designated the "Santa Monica - Malibu Unified School District 2003-2004 Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes (the "Notes"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Notes shall be payable no more than 12 months after the date of issue, and the Notes shall be payable only from revenue received or accrued during the fiscal year in which the Notes were issued; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section §53856 of the Act, the District may pledge any taxes, income, revenue, cash receipts or other moneys deposited in inactive or term deposits (but excepting certain moneys of the District), to the repayment of the Notes, which shall be issued as a general obligation of the District, and to the extent not paid from the taxes, income, revenue, cash receipts and other moneys of the District pledged for the payment thereof, shall be paid with interest thereon from any other moneys of the District lawfully available therefor, as required by Section §53857 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Notes to be issued hereunder in Fiscal Year 2003-2004 when added to the interest payable thereon, may not and do not exceed 85 percent of the estimated amount of the uncollected taxes, income, revenue (including but not limited to revenue from state and federal governments), cash receipts and other moneys of the District which will be available for the payment of principal of the Notes and the interest thereon, as required by Section §53858 of the Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, this Board of Education of the Santa Monica - Malibu Unified School District hereby determines and resolves as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> . <u>Recitals.</u> All of the recitals set forth herein are true and correct, and the District Board so finds and determines.

# Section 2.

Authorization of Issuance of Notes: Terms Thereof. The District Board hereby authorizes the issuance of the Notes in a principal amount not to exceed \$5,000,000, the final principal amount to be determined by the District Superintendent after consultation with the Financial Advisor described in Section 8, below. The Notes are to be numbered from one consecutively upward in order of issuance, to be in the denominations of \$5,000, or integral multiples thereof, as determined by the Treasurer and Tax Collector; to be dated the date of delivery thereof; to mature (without option of prior redemption) 12 months after their date of issue; and to bear interest, payable at maturity and computed on a 30-day month and 360-day year basis, at the rate or rates determined at the time of sale thereof.

Both the principal of and interest on the Notes shall be payable, only upon surrender thereof, in lawful money of the United States of America. The County Treasurer and Tax Collector is authorized to act as a trustee, fiscal agent, paying agent, dissemination agent and/or presentation agent (the "Fiscal Agent") in connection with the Notes, and the County may appoint an agent or other third party to perform any or all of such duties.

### Section 3.

Form of Notes. The Notes shall be issued in fully registered form (except as otherwise provided herein), and shall be substantially in the form and substance set forth in Exhibit A, as attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein, the blanks in said form to be filled in with appropriate words and figures (described in Section 8, below) as the Treasurer and Tax Collector may determine and approve. There shall be delivered with the Notes a legal opinion of Bond Counsel (described in Section 8, below) respecting the validity of the Notes and the exclusion from gross income of the interest thereon for federal income tax purposes and the exemption of interest thereon from present State of California personal income taxes.

# Section 4.

. <u>Deposit of Note Proceeds: No Arbitrage</u>. The proceeds of sale of the Notes (net of costs of issuance) shall be deposited in or to the credit of the general fund of the District or otherwise as directed by the District Superintendent, to be withdrawn and expended for any lawful purpose for which the District is authorized to expend moneys, including, but not limited to, current expenses, capital expenditures and the discharge of any obligations or indebtedness of the District. The District hereby covenants that it will comply with the requirements of the Tax Certificate to be executed by the District

with respect to the Notes and any other instructions requested by or otherwise provided by such Bond Counsel.

### Section 5. Payment of Notes.

- a. <u>Source of Payment</u>. The principal amount of the Notes, together with the interest thereon, shall be payable from taxes, income, revenue, cash receipts and other moneys which are received by the District during, or are attributable to, the 2003-2004 fiscal year and which are available therefor. The Notes shall be a general obligation of the District, and to the extent the Notes are not paid from the Pledged Revenues defined below, the Notes shall be paid with interest thereon from any other moneys of the District lawfully available therefor, as provided herein and by law.
- b. <u>Pledged Revenues</u>. As security for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Notes, the District hereby pledges an amount equal to 50 percent of the principal amount of the Notes from the unrestricted revenues received by the District in the month ending February 28, 2004; an amount equal to 50 percent of the principal amount of the Notes from unrestricted revenues received by the District in the month ending May 31, 2004; and an amount sufficient to pay interest on the Notes and any deficiency in the amount required to be deposited during any prior month, from unrestricted revenues received by the District in the month ending May 31, 2004 (such pledged amounts being hereinafter called the "Pledged Revenues"). The term "unrestricted revenues" shall mean taxes, income, revenue, cash receipts, and other money of the District as provided in Section §53856 of the Act, which are intended as receipts for the general fund of the District and which are generally available for the payment of current expenses and other obligations of the District.

The principal of the Notes and the interest thereon shall be a first lien and charge against and shall be payable from the first moneys received by the District from such Pledged Revenues, as provided by law.

In the event that there are insufficient unrestricted revenues received by the District to permit the deposit into the Repayment Fund, as hereinafter defined, of the full amount of Pledged Revenues to be deposited from unrestricted revenues in a month, then the amount of any deficiency shall be satisfied and made up from any other moneys of the District lawfully available for the repayment of the Notes and the interest thereon.

c. <u>Deposit of Pledged Revenues in Repayment Fund</u>. The Pledged Revenues shall be held by the County in a separate and special fund designated as the "Santa Monica - Malibu Unified School District, 2003-2004 Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes Repayment Fund" (the "Repayment Fund") and the County will administer the Pledged Revenues through and including the maturity date of the Notes and apply such funds as directed in this Resolution. Any moneys deposited in the Repayment Fund shall be for the sole benefit of the owners of the Notes and until the Notes and all interest thereon are paid, or until provision has been made for the payment of the Notes and all interest thereon in accordance with their terms, the moneys in the

Repayment Fund shall be applied only for the purposes for which the Repayment Fund is created. The County Treasurer and Tax Collector is directed to deposit all Pledged Revenues subject to deposit as provided in this Section  $5^{\circ}$  when and as received directly into the Repayment Fund, without further instruction by the District. From the dates of receipt by the County Treasurer and Tax Collector of any of the Pledged Revenues subject to such deposit, the District shall have no right, title or interest therein.

d. <u>Disbursement and Investment of Moneys in Repayment Fund</u>. All Pledged Revenues shall be deposited into the Repayment Fund upon receipt. After such date as the amount of Pledged Revenues on deposit in the Repayment Fund shall be sufficient to pay in full the principal of and interest on the Notes, when due, any moneys in excess of such amount remaining in or accruing to the Repayment Fund shall be transferred to the general fund of the District or otherwise as directed by the District Superintendent. On the maturity date of the Notes, the moneys in the Repayment Fund shall be used, to the extent necessary, to pay the principal of and interest on the Notes.

Moneys in the Repayment Fund, to the greatest extent possible, shall be invested in legally permitted investments as directed by the County Treasurer and Tax Collector or by the District Superintendent, which may include, but not be limited to, a guaranteed investment contract and the Los Angeles County Pooled Investment Fund or any other investment which the County Treasurer and Tax Collector or the District Superintendent deems prudent. The County Treasurer and Tax Collector (who is hereby designated as agent of the District for these purposes) is hereby requested to invest and/or to direct the investment of the proceeds of the Notes in accordance with the Los Angeles County policy governing the investment of such funds.

e. <u>Covenant Regarding Additional Short-term Borrowing</u>. The District hereby covenants and warrants that it will not request the County Treasurer and Tax Collector to make temporary transfers of funds in the custody of the County Treasurer and Tax Collector to meet any obligations of the District during the 2003-2004 fiscal year pursuant to the authority of Article XVI, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State of California or any other legal authority.

# Section 6.

Execution of Notes. The District hereby requests the County Treasurer and Tax Collector, or his designated deputy, and the appropriate officers of the County Board to execute the Notes by their manual or facsimile signatures and to affix a facsimile of the seal of the County thereon; and such officers shall be authorized to cause the blank spaces thereof to be filled in prior to initial delivery as may be appropriate.

### Section 7.

Approval of Sale of Notes. The Notes will be sold at a public or private sale, at the time and place and upon the terms provided in a resolution of the County Board; <u>provided</u> that the aggregate principal amount of the Notes does not exceed \$5,000,000 and the interest rate does not exceed eight percent per annum.

# Section 8.

Authorization and Approval of Preliminary Official Statement and Official Statement. The District hereby appoints The Stiepel Group, Inc. as Financial Advisor to the District and appoints Richards, Watson & Gershon, A Professional Corporation, as Bond Counsel in connection with the issuance of the Notes. The officers of the District are authorized and directed to provide information regarding the District in connection with the preparation of an Official Statement relating to the Notes and any other document or documents relating to the Notes. The Financial Advisor is hereby authorized to prepare and distribute a Preliminary Official Statement and an Official Statement relating to the Notes. Upon inclusion of the information relating to the District therein, the Preliminary Official Statement is, except for certain omissions permitted by Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission promulgated under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended (the "Rule"), hereby deemed final within the meaning of such Rule.

# Section 9. Continuing Disclosure

- a. As required by the Rule, the District covenants with the Noteholders that it will, and hereby authorizes its appropriate officers and employees to provide, in a timely manner, to the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board or each nationally recognized municipal securities information repository and to any California information depository for the benefit of the Noteholders, notice of any of the following events with respect to the Notes, if material:
  - i. principal and interest payment delinquencies;
  - ii. non-payment related defaults;
  - iii. unscheduled draws on the debt service reserves reflecting financial difficulties:
  - iv. unscheduled draws on credit enhancements reflecting financial difficulties:
  - v. substitution of credit or liquidity providers, or their failure to perform;
  - vi. adverse tax opinions or events affecting the tax-exempt status of the securities:
  - vii. modifications to rights of security holders;
  - viii. bond calls; ix. defeasances:

- x. release, substitution, or sale of property securing repayment of the securities; and
- xi. rating changes.

Notwithstanding any other provision herein, failure of the District to perform in accordance with this Section 9(A) shall not constitute a default under this Resolution and may be enforced only as provided in this Section 9.

- b. Each Material Event Notice shall be so captioned and shall prominently state the title, date and CUSIP numbers of the affected Notes;
- c. The District represents that since July 3, 1995, it has not failed to comply in any material respect with any previous undertaking in a written contract or agreement specified in paragraph (b)(5)(I) of the Rule.
- d. This Section may be amended, by written agreement of the parties, without the consent of the holders of the Notes (except to the extent required under clause (iv) below), if all of the following conditions are satisfied: (I) such amendment is made in connection with a change in circumstances that arises from a change in legal (including regulatory) requirements, a change in law (including rules or regulations) or in interpretations thereof, or a change in the identity, nature or status of the District or the type of business conducted thereby, (ii) this Section as so amended would have complied with the requirements of the Rule as of the date of this Resolution, after taking into account any amendments or interpretations of the Rule, as well as any change in circumstances, (iii) the District shall have delivered to the County an opinion of Bond Counsel, addressed to the District and the County, to the same effect as set forth in clause (ii) above, (iv) either (a) the District shall have delivered to the County an opinion of Bond Counsel or a determination by a person, in each case unaffiliated with the District (such as Bond Counsel or the County) and acceptable to the District, addressed to the District and the County, to the effect that the amendment does not materially impair the interests of the holders of the Notes, or (b) the holders of the Notes consent to the amendment to this Section 9 pursuant to the same procedures as are otherwise required for amendments, and (v) the District shall have delivered copies of such opinion(s) and amendment to each NRMSIR and any CID.
  - i. In addition to subsection (D)(1) above, this Section 9 may be amended and any provision of this Section may be waived, by written agreement of the parties, without the consent of the holders of the Notes, if all of the following conditions are satisfied: (I) an amendment to the Rule is adopted, or a new or modified official interpretation of the Rule is issued, after the effective date of this Section 9 which is applicable to this Section 9, (ii) the District shall have delivered to the County an opinion of Bond Counsel, addressed to the District and the County, to the effect that performance by the District and the County under this Section as so amended or giving effect to such waiver, as the case may be, will not result in a violation of the Rule and (iii) the District shall have delivered copies of such

opinion and amendment to each NRMSIR and any CID.

- e. The provisions of this Section 9 shall inure solely to the benefit of the holders from time to time of the Notes, except that beneficial owners of Notes shall be third-party beneficiaries of this Section 9.
  - i Except as provided in this subsection (E)(2), the provisions of this Section 9 shall create no rights in any person or entity. The obligations of the District to comply with the provisions of this Section 9 shall be enforceable in the case of enforcement of obligations to provide notices, by any Registered Owner of outstanding Notes, or by the Fiscal Agent on behalf of the Registered Owners of outstanding Notes, provided, however, that the Fiscal Agent shall not be required to take any enforcement action except at the direction of the Registered Owners of not less than a majority in aggregate principal amount of the Notes at the time outstanding who shall have provided the Fiscal Agent with adequate security and indemnity. The Registered Owners' and Fiscal Agent's rights to enforce the provisions of this Section 9 shall be limited solely to a right, by action in mandamus or for specific performance, to compel performance of the District's obligations under this Section 9. In consideration of the third-party beneficiary status of beneficial owners of Notes pursuant to subsection (1) of this Section 9, beneficial owners shall be deemed to be Registered Owners of Notes for purposes of this subsection (B).
- f. For the purposes of this Resolution, unless the content otherwise requires, the terms defined in this Section 9, for all purposes of this Resolution, have the meanings specified herein:

"Bond Counsel" means an attorney or firm of attorneys of nationally recognized standing in matters pertaining to the validity of, and tax-exempt nature of interest on, obligations issued by states and their political subdivisions.

"Material Event" means any of the events with respect to the Notes, as set forth in Section (9)(A) above.

"Material Event Notice" means notice of a Material Event.

"MSRB" means the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board established pursuant to Section 15B(b)(1) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

"NRMSIR" means, at any time, a then-existing nationally recognized municipal securities information repository, as recognized from time to time by the SEC for the purposes referred to in the Rule. The NRMSIRs as of the date of this Resolution are Bloomberg Municipal Repositories, DPC Data Inc., Standard & Poor's J.J. Kenny Repository, and FT Interactive Data.

"Register" means the book or book of registration kept by the Registrar in which are maintained the names and addresses and principal amounts registered to each Registered Owner.

"Registered Owner" means the Person in whose name a Note is registered on the Register.

"Registrar" means the Fiscal Agent, or a substitute Registrar.

"CID" means, at any time, a then-existing state information depository, if any, as operated or designated as such by or on behalf of the State of California for the purposes referred to in the Rule. As of the date of this Resolution, there is no CID.

# Section 10.

. <u>Delivery of Notes</u>. The proper officers of the County are hereby requested to deliver the Notes to the original purchaser. All actions heretofore taken by the officers and agents of the District with respect to the Notes are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified, and the officers of the District are hereby authorized and directed to do any and all things and take any and all actions which they, or any of them, may deem necessary or advisable in order to consummate the lawful issuance and delivery of the Notes in accordance with this Resolution and resolutions hereafter adopted by the County Board.

### Section 11.

Eurther Actions Authorized. It is hereby covenanted that the District, and its appropriate officials, have duly taken all proceedings necessary to be taken by them, and will take any additional proceedings necessary to be taken by them, for the levy, collection and enforcement of the taxes and other revenues pledged under this Resolution in accordance with the law and for carrying out the provisions of this Resolution. The District Superintendent, officers and staff of the District are hereby directed to take such further action as may be necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution and to execute and deliver any and all agreements, certificates and other documents that they or Bond Counsel may deem necessary or advisable to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution without further approval of this District Board.

### Section 12.

Limited Liability. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein or in the Notes or in any other document mentioned herein, the District shall not have any liability hereunder or by reason hereof or in connection with the transactions contemplated hereby except to the extent payable from moneys available therefor as set forth in Section 5 hereof and the County is not liable for payment on the Notes or any other obligation of the District hereunder.

The transfer shall be accounted for as temporary borrowing between funds or accounts and shall not be available for appropriation or be considered income to the borrowing fund or account. Similar actions have been approved by the Board in prior years to meet cost flow needs.

RE: AUTHORIZATION OF ONE-YEAR RESTRUCTURING OF DAC REPORTS

#### RECOMMENDATION NO. A.16

It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the following restructuring of the District Advisory Committee (DAC) report process for one year only. This suggestion is being made in light of the current budget crises brought upon the district by the severe reduction in State funding to public education.

COMMENT: Typically, each Board-appointed DAC is encouraged to present a year-end report to the Board that both outlines its accomplishments of the previous year and offers thoughtful suggestions relative to the wants and needs of the committee's discreet constituency. (Board Policy and Administrative Regulations 1220; available on the district's website, <a href="www.smmusd.org">www.smmusd.org</a>, click on "I Want to Know About," scroll down to and select "Policies.")

The incredible budget cuts that the district is now forced with making suggests that this reporting process be changed for one year only. It is staff's opinion that early input from each DAC would be very helpful to the Board in its budget-decision making process.

Through early interface, the Board would have a precise indication of which, if any, of the particular kinds of services currently being considered for discontinuance or reduction are most important to a given constituency. Additionally, the reports would be structured in such a way as to allow for an appropriate, highly specific public forum. Finally, staff believes that in providing this reporting opportunity to the community, two additional purposes may be achieved:

- 1) dissemination of new and vital budgetary information
- possible identification of new revenue streams for district programs.

While it is understood that the timing is very tight, it is also presumed that each committee is keenly aware of what proposals it would make in its regular Spring report and that any such ideas would be made in correlation to the district's adopted Strategic Plan.

It is therefore suggested that each committee:

- select 20-minute time slot from those provided below; the time slots would be guaranteed on a first-come, first-serve basis
- 2) prepare a report for the Board that would follow these
   quidelines:
  - A) 5-7 minutes: careful delineation of which particular kinds of services are most valued by the committee and why. This segment would include rationale, statistics, projected impact on all stakeholders, etc.
  - B) **2-3 minutes:** NEW suggestions for increasing field-specific revenue streams
  - C) 2-3 minutes: NEW or amended strategies for crosscurricular teaming to maximize the dollars the district does have
  - D) 2-3 minutes: NEW or amended action plans for supporting the ideas, specifically tied to the strategic plan
  - E) 2-3 minutes: staff liaison comments

At the end of 20 minutes the report would stop. Period.

Committees not wishing to participate at this time would be given the standard reporting opportunity in May.

The final variance in the reporting process would be that there would be no commitment of any district funding for any of the proposals.

Committees to report are:

Child Care and Development Community Health & Safety
Fine Arts Instructional Technology
Intercultural Advisory Special Education
Sports and Physical Education

Other Board-appointed committees (Chapter One, Gifted and Talented, Bilingual) may report as well by following the above-listed procedure. Moving forward in such a way seems vital to the Board's deep understanding of the wishes of the its constituents.

RE: MIDDLE SCHOOL ALGEBRA PLAN

DISCUSSION NO. D.1

It is recommended that the Board of Education discuss a proposed plan developed by the Santa Monica Malibu Unified School District Math Committee designed to accelerate the achievement of all middle school students. Through this plan all students will be able to enter the ninth grade ready for geometry or a higher level class.

COMMENTS: This discussion item is centered on a proposed plan designed to accelerate the achievement of all middle students by enabling them to take Algebra 1 before the 9th grade thereby meeting the California State Standards for the study of Mathematics. While each middle school currently has students finishing Algebra, not all students have had this opportunity. This plan will outline the classes and support systems that will greatly increase the likelihood that all students will be ready to take Geometry, or a higher level course, in the ninth grade. These students will then be eligible to take advanced math courses, which greatly increases their opportunities to satisfy the entrance requirements of many competitive colleges and universities.

DISCUSSION NO. D.2

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the following potential restorations to the 2003-04 budget:

COMMENTS: As we proceed with our deliberations on how to balance the 2003-04 budget, staff presented the Board an extensive list of budget reductions to consider. Staff recommended and the Board approved all the reductions which now total \$13.7 million. These reductions represent as equitable an application as possible to all programs and services. Staff believes that we should begin our 2003-04 budget planning by establishing a starting point that is \$13.7 million lower than our current budget.

Staff further recommends that the Board begin a process to establish guidelines that would restore budget cuts as additional revenue becomes available. The Board may not be able to restore all the proposed reductions, but an attempt should be made to develop a list of programs and services that would be restored by the successful passage of our <u>School Funding Measure</u>, additional ongoing support (from the Cities), and the hopeful restoration of State and Federal categorical programs.

To begin the process of establishing a method to determine the order to which programs and services should be restored, staff recommends that the Board begin the process by establishing a commitment to restore the teaching and administrative staff to the core education program. Namely, the recommendation is to first restore elementary education staffing, then to restore middle school and high school staffing. All other proposed budget cuts could be considered for restoration after the staffing of the basic education system is restored.

It is critical to establish these packages of possible restoration as a <u>flexible</u> plan - a road map, if you will, given what we know today. It is almost assured that the financial picture will be different in June and, as such, you allow yourself the latitude to adjust decisions accordingly.

From the initial budget cuts of \$13.7 million, staff proposes the first restoration be at the elementary schools, followed by the restoration of staff at the middle and high schools:
