A regular meeting of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Board of Education was held on Thursday, April 24, 2003, in the Board Room of the District's Administrative Offices, 1651 16th Street Santa Monica. IV BOARD OF EDUCATION - COMMENDATIONS / RECOGNITIONS

Edison School Report - Student Council Officers Reuben Tomlins, President; Pablo Valdez, Vice-President; and Gyasi Jackson, Historian, addressed the Board of Education. They spoke about the benefits of being educated in two languages and the advantages of opportunities that may become available to them because they will be bilingual. Principal Stephen Martinez reviewed the events taking place at Edison this school year. PTSA sponsors a number of activities for students in addition to fund raising projects, including field trips, assemblies, student appreciation week in June, supplies for classroom teachers, earthquake supplies and purchasing library furniture. Teacher appreciation luncheons take place two to three times a year. First aide and CPR training for parents and teachers is provided through PTSA. PTSA has been very active and has the largest membership at the school this year. The President of Honduras visited the school recently.

She suggested a lunch suspension for three days so that students would not be missing class, but still be punished with having their social hour taken away. She stated that she felt the educational environment would be upheld which she felt should be the goal of discipline.

Ms. Hoff suggested that students should spend spring break in preparation for AP tests which are fast approaching. The prom is scheduled for May 23, directly after AP tests. Lastly, Ms. Hoss noted that seniors have until May 1st to determine where they will attend collect.

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the attached Resolution No. 02-29: Visual and Performing Arts, "Arts Education Demonstration Project Grant".

COMMENT The 18th Street Arts complex shares a partnership with the SMMUSD, called the "Arts Education Demonstration Project Grant" and is funded by the California Arts Council. Last year our partnership received \$117,760 in grant funding from the CAC, but with the state budget crisis, we are requesting \$100,000 and hope to receive as much a possible towards the project.

Initiated in 1966, SMARTS pairs professional artists with classroom teachers in public schools to teach curriculumbased arts education. While imparting basic arts techniques, appreciation and creative problem solving skills to schoolchildren our artists develop teaching and community building expertise as well. To date this program has served over 2,200 students in six schools, and trained nearly 100 artists and two dozen schoolteachers.

The SMARTS In the Schools Project facilitates the inclusion of visual and performing arts education in the full range of subject matter addressed in the school curriculum in order to:

- 1 Enhance academic achievement in other subject areas including vocabulary, reading comprehension, and writing skills.
- 2) Encourage changes in attitudes, that is, enable the power of creative expression to articulate and/or transform personal identities, and improve self-esteem.
- 3) Provide opportunities to learn and collaborative skills, and judgment.

The Demonstration Projects address arts in education in K-12 public schools that make the case for the importance of the arts to the complete education of every child. Developed to evaluate how art makes a difference - both for individual students and for individual schools - each funded project is a partnership between an arts organization and an educational institution. A hallmark of this program is to identify models that can be replicated in other sites. In the first year of the project, fifty-eight Demonstration Projects served 62,850 students, 2,087 teachers, 1,684 classrooms, 504 schools and 103 districts.

In Santa Monica, there are a rich variety of arts opportunities for our schools to take advantage of. This grant will allow the SMMUSD and 18th Street Arts Complex to bring these opportunities to our students...where they belong.

Providing children with a variety of foods makes it more likely that their nutritional requirements will be met. Studies show that poor children who attend school hungry perform significantly below non-hungry low-income peers on standardized test scores.

COMMENT: Based on the preceding agreement, Recommendation

No.A 20, this is the second project identified by the City of Santa Monica as an energy conservation project

funded by utility taxes.

The District requested proposals (RFP) for light fixture replacements based on an energy audit completed earlier this year by Henrikson Owen. Wheatstone was the most responsive to the RFP, by offering retrofit recommendations, new fixture replacement, daylight controls(use of natural light) and motion sensors.

As there was no job walk conducted for contractors bidding the project, Wheatstone Energy will conduct audits of Santa Monica sites: Edison, Grant, Franklin, McKinley, Muir/SMASH, Rogers, Roosevelt, Administration Building, and submit a final recommendation for an energy efficient design. The audit is included in the total cost proposal of the project.

This lighting project completes work not covered under Prop X construction. The areas of replacement are primarily custodial closets, relocatable classrooms which come with standard T12 lighting, Olympic High School and the Administration office which did not have construction dollars allocated for such projects.

RFP documents were sent to seven (7) contractors. Two responsive proposals were received. The costs listed below reflect complete replacement of the fixtures listed:

Wheatstone Energy \$499,651 Diamond Electric \$633,150

District and City staff reviewed RFP documents and determined that Wheatstone Energy was the most responsive bidder.

RE: PRELIMINARY 2003-04 BUDGET PLANNING

DISCUSSION NO. D.2

The purpose of this Discussion Item is to initiate a dialogue between the Board and Staff regarding the development of the District's 2003-04 Budget.

In this year of unprecedented financial crisis, the Board must develop a balanced budget without knowing the full impact of pending legislative action. The legislature has not chosen to follow the Governor's budget proposal that would cover a \$34 billion State budget deficit. There are rumors that the State budget deficit has grown since the Governor's State Budget address in January; it is suggested that the May Budget Revise by the Governor will show a deficit of \$40 billion.

Even as we meet to discuss our 2003-04 Budget, the legislature has been unable to make any significant progress to address this financial crisis. The mid-year cuts (SBXI 18) although painful, represent a small portion of the potential impact on the District. The 2.15% Revenue Limit mid-year cut has been deferred until 2003-04. The proposed 12% cut in categorical funding has still not been enacted. A stalemate between Democrats and Republicans continues. It appears that neither party is fully willing to compromise party positions in favor of passing a State Budget by June 30, 2003. Since it is unlikely that we will receive the State budget much before school starts in September, we will need to make financial decisions without knowing all the details that will affect the District's financial position.

It is appropriate for the Board to take steps to reduce the current budget to reflect what is currently known about our finances. Therefore, the 2003-04 Budget is being prepared to reflect the decision that the Board made to reduce \$13.7 million from its current budget.

In addition to these program and staff reductions, further categorical program cuts must be enacted to reflect mid-year revenue reductions and to reflect revenue deferrals into 2003-04. We continue to work to reduce categorical programs which had required General Fund support. These efforts are not yet complete but the budget will reflect no Local General Fund Contributions (LGFC) to any categorical program except Special Education, Special Education Transportation and Summer School programs.

To begin the process of developing the 2003-04 Budget, the following assumptions are being used. These assumptions have been developed using recommendations from the Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE), State Superintendent Jack O'Connell, School Services of California, Inc., and are also based upon previous Board actions.

BUDGET ASSUMPTIONS FOR 2003-04

Revenues

- 1. District Revenue Limit projections reflect a reduction of 2.15% as was passed by State legislators in their mid-year budget reductions, then subsequently deferred until the 2003-04 budget year. The actual reductions in Revenue Limit dollars is \$1,489,627. We will be using \$4,810.84 as 2003-04 Base Revenue Limit per ADA.
- 2. District enrollment, as projected by Rick Bagley in the report to the Board of Education on January 30, 2003, is estimated to be 12,711 students. The current year's CBEDs count was 12,789. Therefore, the enrollment projection reflects an enrollment reduction of 78 students. For the purposes of calculating the Revenue Limit, we will use the current year's P-2 ADA count of 12,160 ADA. This reflects an additional 75 ADA over the same period in 2001-02.
- 3. The Lottery allocation is estimated to be \$126 per pupil, of which \$113 per pupil is for unrestricted expenditures and \$13 per pupil is for Proposition 20 Mandated for Instructional Materials.
- 4. State Categorical Programs are proposed to be cut by 12.4%. This represents the Governor's proposed reductions of:
- ♦ 3.66% for 2002-03
- ♦ 7.46% additional reductions for 2002-03
- ♦ 1.28% proposed cuts for 2003-04

Although the legislators have not yet passed this reduction, it is anticipated that this cut will be included in next year's budget.

5. In addition to the 12.4% reductions, mid-year cuts were implemented to the following categorical programs:

♦ Instructional Materials \$212,859

♦ PEER Review & Assistance Program \$ 35,765

♦ Library Materials Program \$\frac{\$19,950}{\$70tal:}\$

These reductions will carry through to 2003-04.

6. Categorical funding deferrals of approximately 25% of the 2002-03 entitlements will be carried forward into 2003-04 for a reduction of \$499,955, as follows:

♦	School Improvement Program	\$187,592
♦	Home-to-School Transportation	\$109,879
♦	Special Education Transportation	\$101,721
♦	Targeted Instructional Improvement Grant	\$100,763

- 7. The legislature has suspended all payments for Mandated Cost Reimbursement Claims. This has caused us to remove \$667,400 from the current year's budget, and to eliminate \$440,000 from the 2003-04 budget.
- 8. The Class-Size Reduction Program is anticipated to be funded at \$906 per pupil for Grades K-3 and at \$180 per pupil for Ninth Grade Class-Size Reduction.
- 9. It is anticipated that the Deferred Maintenance Program will not be funded in the 2003-04 year, so neither the funding nor the required match will be budgeted.
- 10. Provisions for teacher staff development outside of the regular instructional year ("Buy-Back Days") will not be included in this budget.
- 11. Federal revenues are anticipated to be the same as this year.
- 12. The local Parcel Tax for \$101.14 plus a CPI-U adjustment is estimated to generate \$3,278,121, based on 32,413 parcels.

- 13. The District estimates the local revenues to be \$100,000 from leases and rentals, \$587,329 from the DoubleTree Hotel, and \$800,000 for the Madison School site.
- 14. The District anticipates receiving \$3,000,000 of financial support from the City of Santa Monica, \$500,000 of which will be designated for multi-cultural education efforts.

Expenditures

- 1. Instructional staffing will be based on a 30 to 1 teacher/pupil ratio for elementary schools, 35 to 1 for middle schools, and 37 to 1 for high schools. Grades K-2 will be staffed at 20 to 1. There is a total certificated staffing reduction of 102 FTEs in the amount of \$6,721,663 and a 20% cut in classified positions of 24.12 FTEs in the amount of \$1,289,853. In addition, there are department reductions in the amount of \$1,952,669.
- 2. The budget will maintain the schools' Formula Money allocation for instructional supplies similar to 2002-03:
- ★ K-5 \$30.21 per pupil
 ★ 6-8 \$40.92 per pupil
 ★ 9-12 \$66.54 per pupil

Lottery Instructional Materials funds (Proposition 20) will be used to fund this allocation.

- 3. The premium rates for District-paid employee medical and dental benefits are budgeted for a 15% increase.
- 4. The school site allocations for Extra Duty Units (EDUs) and athletic transportation will be funded at the same level as 2002-03. Consideration is being given to the reduction of teacher hourly budgets that currently fund many teacher activities outside of the classroom.
- 5. The Special Education and Special Education Transportation budgets will need to be supported with unrestricted General Fund revenues. It is estimated that the Special Education budget will need to be increased by \$800,000.
- 6. Categorical budgets will be reduced by 12.4%, along with the mid-year cuts of \$268,576, as well as the funding deferrals of \$499,955. The Block Grant proposal will effect our abilities to continue our current State categorical programs.

- 7. Categorical programs that require a General Fund contribution are being reduced, commensurate with their revenues. New reduced budgets for EIA, Bilingual Education, Science Magnet and Summer School programs are being considered.
- 8. Special Service contracts and certain miscellaneous independent contractor agreements have been eliminated in the amount of \$998,257.
- 9. All capital expenditure budgets have been eliminated from the budget (6000 object code series).
- 10. The payment of approximately \$250,000 debt service payment on the 20-year Certificate of Participation (COP) issued to fund a portion of Santa Monica High School Phase III will be paid from the Capital Facilities Fund (Fund 25) instead of the General Fund.
- 9. Due to our participation in the State's School Facilities Modernization Program, we are currently required to budget 3% of the General Fund for facility maintenance.
- 10. Provisions have been made to budget 3% for the Reserve for Economic Uncertainties as required by State Statute.

INFORMATIONAL ITEM NO. I.1

At its meeting of February 20, 2003 (item A.27.a.5), the Board of Education adopted Resolution 02-15 (Reduction or Discontinuance of Particular Kinds of Services) relative to personnel in categorically funded programs.

Up through this year, funding for categorical programs was provided separately for each program. The Governor's budget for 2003-04 now combines all categorical funding into one "block grant". The State is consequently giving Boards of Education the flexibility and authority to allocate funds among the various programs, as each Governing Board deems appropriate for their particular district.

Because we do not yet know how these funds will be allocated or which categorical programs the district will retain or modify, it was recommended as a precautionary measure that the Board authorize preparation for reduction or discontinuance of particular kinds of categorical services as may be determined at a later date.

In preparation for possible reduction or elimination of particular kinds of categorically funded services, some certificated personnel will be reassigned from their current positions, to other positions for which they are properly credentialed. The list attached indicates the individuals who will be so impacted.

Currently, we cannot know the exact school site location to which each of these individuals will be assigned. It is anticipated that determination will not be fully known until early June. At such time reassignments are made, the specific procedures outlined in the Agreement between the Board and the Santa Monica-Malibu Classroom Teachers' Association (SMMCTA) will be implemented to make specific assignment determinations.

This item is for the Board's information only as no formal action is required to reassign these certificated personnel.
