COMMENTS: Due to the complexity of Santa Monica High School program, and the additional allocation of funding to the site, it has been determined that in order to proceed with the design at Santa Monica High School, a study of the entire campus would be prudent. The proposed scope of the Siting Study for Samohi would include 3 alternate siting studies, which would determine various building locations throughout the campus.

History

At the time the original agreement for the Measure "BB" project at Santa Monica High School was negotiated, the scope of potential future site planning options related to joint use studies with the City of Santa Monica was not adequately developed to reach a definitive lump sum agreement for programming and schematic design. The scope of services was based on the Measure "BB" project description and the Board of Education direction provided at the meeting on October 18, 2007.

In a series of discussions amongst the City of Santa Monica staff and district staff, the city has committed to proceeding with the selection of a separate consultant to support exploration of joint use opportunities as related to the Civic Auditorium Campus and the Santa Monica High School campus on either side of $4^{\rm th}$ street. The consultant for the city will develop the conceptual land use and site studies of the Civic Center site, taking into account potential joint use opportunities, especially cultural and recreational.

R.L. Binder was requested to prepare a proposal for development of siting studies of the Santa Monica High School campus that would explore and illustrate siting of new functions on the campus, which may include a soccer field, football field with full CIF track, stadium, and structured parking - alternatives with scopes and budgets beyond the scope of the base agreement and Measure "BB" project base scope of work.

Three siting studies will be performed: low, moderate, and high impact. The studies will show progressively more complex and expanded scopes of work with corresponding conceptual costs starting with the most restrictive constraints (500 ft. set back from edge of nearest traffic lane, I-10, historic building restrictions) and ending with the most extensive (replacement of Technology, Science, Language, Administration Cafeteria, Music, Gym, and Natatorium buildings).

In addition, the siting studies will be performed in coordination with the consultant selected by the City of Santa Monica, with input on potential Joint Use functions and include two community workshops in partnership with the city team.

During its 1/17/08 meeting, the Board of Education approved \$50,000 of the \$180,000 siting study proposal (Change Order #1) to begin this work.

SUBTOPIC POLICY REGULATION EXHIBIT

Employee Safety X

DETAIL

The Board of Education believes that safety is every employee's responsibility. The Board expects all employees to use safe work practices and to report and correct any unsafe conditions which may occur. Supervisors shall constantly promote safety and correct any unsafe work practice through education, training and enforcement.

No employees shall be required to work under unsafe or hazardous conditions or to perform tasks which endanger their health, safety, or well-being. The supervisor and co-workers will be sensitive and receptive to the opinion of the employee who expresses concern regarding a directive to perform a task which the employee considers unsafe, and to the employee who feels that the unsafe task is a result of the employee working out of class. Board of Education Policy 4604 - Complaints Concerning School Personnel is applicable for situations where a difference of opinion regarding a safety issue is not resolved. According to Labor Code 6310, retaliation for filing a complaint is prohibited. (BP 1312.1 - Complaints Concerning District Employees)

Working conditions and equipment shall be maintained in compliance with standards prescribed by federal, state, and local laws and regulations.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish, implement and maintain a written injury and illness prevention program, in accordance with law. The program shall include training in safe and healthy work practices for all employees. (Labor Code 6401.7)

The Board shall ensure that the Superintendent or designee provides eye protective devices as specified in law and administrative regulation. (CCR, Title 8, 3382)

DETAIL

The Board of Education desires to provide its employees with workers' compensation insurance and benefits in accordance with law. The Superintendent or designee shall develop an efficient claims handling process in order to reduce costs and facilitate employee recovery.

An employee shall report any work-related injury or illness to his/her supervisor as soon as practical. Upon learning of an injury, a supervisor shall promptly report the incident to the Superintendent or designee and the insurance carrier as appropriate.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that every new employee is notified of his/her right to receive workers' compensation if injured at work and that injured employees are given notice in accordance with law.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that notifications regarding workers' compensation are posted in accordance with law.

DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.01

The Board of Education authorized a detailed study of enrollment projections by DecisionInsite, a private company specializing in this area. The board will hear a presentation on the enrollment projections, which are based not only on enrollment in prior years, but on outside factors related to census data.

Staff will be using this data for staffing allocations in the 2008-09 school year. The board has asked for the long range data not only to make accurate staffing projections, but also to examine the projects included in the Measure "BB" facilities program. The study includes a "conservative" projection and a "moderate" projection. Staff recommends using the conservative projection for staffing allocations, and the moderate projection for the planning of construction. Staff is in the process of sharing the enrollment projections with schools, and making initial recommendations for staffing in 2008-09.

A Final Report, written by the DecisionInsite company, is available in the Superintendent's Office. District staff and representatives from DecisionInsite will be available for questions and discussion at the meeting.

2008-09 BUDGET

DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.02

This report has been prepared in order to provide members of the Board of Education a continuing opportunity for discussion regarding development of the district's 2008-09 Budget.

During the development of the 2007-0008 Budget, the Board of Education was presented six Policy areas to consider. These areas continue to be important as we develop future budgets.

- Review of SMMUSD Vision Statement and Student Outcomes (Attachment A)
- Review of Principles for Guiding Future Budgetary Decisions (Attachment B)
- Review of 2008-09 Budget Allocation and Staffing Guidelines (Attachment C)

In conjunction with those Guidelines, reductions in staffing will continue to occur as enrollment declines and other opportunities for administrative or operational changes become available.

Continue to achieve budgetary savings and <u>recognize the</u> necessity for ongoing budgetary reductions.

Based on all current budgetary indicators, there is a necessity for ongoing budget reductions. Activities in this area are anticipated to intensify beginning with the 2008-09 Budget.

Use of District Categorical Program Funding and District "Other Funds"

Monitor the current and potential availability of categorical program funding and other District funds to help retain important core instructional programs and/or moderate the level of program reductions that would otherwise occur.

Explore ways to reduce the financial impact of the continuing decline in student enrollment.

<u>Note</u>: The loss of Revenue Limit funding associated with the decline in student enrollment presents one of the most significant fiscal challenges faced by the District.

School Services of California, Inc. has recommended that declining enrollment districts consider the following:

- Formulating and implementing a strategic district plan that compensates for enrollment losses
- Focusing on improving the district's ADA-to-enrollment ratio
- Seeking out alternative methods for providing district services
- Fully utilizing State and Federal funding flexibility
- Thoughtfully ratcheting down staffing to reflect enrollment
- Managing facilities, especially those that may be vacant or underutilized

Looking ahead to 2008-09, 2009-10, and 2010-11

As we begin discussions for development of the 2008-09 District Budget, there comes the necessity for a new three-year budgetary strategy (2008-09 through 20010-11). This strategy must ensure the long-term financial health of the District. In this regard, it is prudent to begin a budgetary "look ahead" to consider possible changes that may be required beginning in 2008-09.

Impact of the Governor's Proposed Budget for 2007-08 on K-12 Education Funding

As previously mentioned, the Governor's Proposed Budget acknowledges the growing Budget crisis, identifying a June 2009 deficit of \$14.5 billion. The Governor seeks to suspend Proposition 98 and reduce school funding by 4 billion dollars. If this occurs, school district budgets will suffer a net 2.4% reduction of revenue limit resources. Additionally, the Governor proposes a 6.5% cut in categorical funds, including Special Education.

Multi-Year Financial Projection

The District's Multi-Year Financial Projection (MYFP) is periodically revised to reflect the most current information. The income and expenditure estimates used in conjunction with the preparation of the $2^{\rm nd}$ Interim Financial Report will be made available in the near future. An update of the MYFP reflecting the income and expenditure estimates through 2010-11 will be presented to the Board of Education with the $2^{\rm nd}$ Interim Report.

At the middle and high schools, students generally take six periods and teachers teach 5 periods. Using the above staffing ratios for the middle schools (31:1) and the high schools (31:1), and controlling by a 6/5ths formula, the actual student/teacher ratio in grades six to twelve is below 30:1. The following example uses a high school with an enrollment of 3000 students with each student taking six periods and teachers teaching five periods:

 $3000 \div 31:1 \times 6 \div 5 = 116$ teachers. If you then divide the 3000 students by 116 teachers, the actual student/teacher ratio is 25.9:1
