

Dear Families,

Advancement Via Individual Determination, AVID, is a seventh through twelfth grade college readiness program. Students in the AVID Elective enroll in rigorous courses and receive the support needed to succeed in those courses. AVID is not a remedial course. Your student has been identified as someone who has potential and could benefit from the skills that will be taught and from the peer community in the AVID Elective class. The educators at your student's school believe your child can improve and succeed academically as they prepare for college and a career with the help of AVID.

The AVID elective class meets everyday during the school day and supports students as they challenge themselves in more rigorous classes such as Honors and AP courses. Students are taught study skills, note taking, time management, writing and research skills, while being immersed in a college-going culture. The class also includes collaborative tutorial sessions lead by students and provides support for success in the academically rigorous curriculum. Additionally, the AVID class provides access to information about colleges and universities through field trips, guest speakers, college tutors, scholarship opportunities and college admission requirement information.

Students in the academic middle often move through our educational systems without any special recognition, positive or negative. While many of these students go on to graduate from high school, they are often not college-ready upon graduation. When a school has AVID, students in the AVID Elective and throughout the school are held to higher expectations and given the support they need to succeed and prepare for postsecondary opportunities. By pushing students into more rigorous coursework, encouraging, assisting, and advocating for them every day, AVID greatly increase their likelihood of making it to and through college.

AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) es un programa del séptimo al doceavo grado que prepara a los estudiantes académicamente para ser admitidos a la universidad. Su estudiante fue nominado/elegido porque demuestra potencial no solo para matricularse y tener éxito en clases rigurosas, sino también para asistir a la universidad de su elección. AVID no es una clase de recuperación. Los estudiantes de AVID Elective se matriculan en clases rigurosas y reciben el apoyo necesario para tener éxito. Su estudiante fue identificado como alguien que tiene potencial y que puede beneficiarse de las habilidades que aprenderá y de pertenecer a una comunidad de compañeros en la clase AVID Elective. Los educadores de la escuela de su estudiante creen que su hijo puede mejorar y tener éxito académico a medida que se prepara para la universidad y una profesión con la ayuda de AVID.

El componente principal del programa AVID es la clase electiva de AVID. La clase apoya a los estudiantes cuando ellos mismos se retan con clases más rigurosas como clases de honores or AP. A los estudiantes se les enseña las habilidades del estudio, cómo tomar notas, organizar su calendario y horario, la escritura y la investigación académica, mientras que son sumergidos en un ambiente cultural al nivel universitario. La clase también incluye sesiones de colaboración con tutores universitarios que apoyan a los estudiantes para el éxito en sus estudios académicos. Además, la clase AVID proporciona el acceso a la información sobre colegios comunitarios y universidades con excursiones, oradores invitados, tutores de la universidad, oportunidades de becas y la información de los requisitos para la admisión a la universidad.

Los estudiantes académicamente intermedios con frecuencia pasan por el sistema educativo sin reconocimiento, ya sea positivo o negativo. Aunque muchos de ellos se gradúan de preparatoria, muchas veces no están preparados para la universidad. Cuando la escuela implementa AVID, los estudiantes de AVID y de toda la escuela están sujetos a expectativas más altas, reciben el apoyo necesario para tener éxito y se preparan para las oportunidades postsecundarias. Motivando a los estudiantes a tomar clases más rigurosas, apoyándolos, asistiéndolos y abogando por ellos todos los días, AVID aumenta considerablemente la probabilidad de que tengan acceso y finalicen sus estudios superiores.
