Quality Education and Facilities for our Local Students

The Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District (SMMUSD) serves approximately 9,200 students in eight elementary schools, two middle schools and two high schools within the City of Santa Monica. Highly qualified teachers and staff and strong academic programs support Santa Monica students to achieve some of the state's highest honors and enable them to go on to top colleges. School facilities are also integral to the quality of education. However, some Santa Monica High School classrooms are in

100-year-old buildings that need to be replaced or modernized to support 21st-century learning, and repairs and upgrades are needed at all Santa Monica schools to meet today's academic and safety standards.



In June of this year, we mailed a survey asking for the community's opinions regarding improvements to the District's educational facilities. Here is what the Santa Monica community told us was most important:


