ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY

Students are expected to come to school ready to learn. Since we are committed to providing a learning environment free from distractions John Adams Middle School has the expectation that all electronic devices are turned off and put away for the duration of the school day.

The use of electronic devices for nonacademic use on campus is only allowed BEFORE and AFTER school.

Electronic devices include, but are not limited to:
cell phones, cameras, iPods/MP3 players, laptops/tablets, portable speakers, handheld electronic games, headphones/earbuds, etc.

Should a student be in violation of this policy, the following progressive steps will be taken:

If consequences after third offense do not remedy the problem administrators will consult with parent(s) to discuss a permanent solution.

Students and their parents/guardians take full responsibility for **any and all** electronic signaling devices (including cell phones), which the student may bring to school.

In no event or circumstance will the district or its staff be held responsible or liable for the loss, theft or damage to any such device. This includes the loss, theft, or damage of confiscated cell phones and similar devices (SMMUSD AR 5131.8).
