Why are we here?

EC 32288 specifies:

- (a) In order to ensure compliance with this article, each school shall forward its comprehensive school safety plan to the school district or county office of education for approval.
- (b) (1) Before adopting its comprehensive school safety plan, the school site council or school safety planning committee shall hold a public meeting at the school site in order to allow members of the public the opportunity to express an opinion about the school safety plan.
- (2) The school site council or school safety planning committee shall notify, in writing, the following persons and entities, if available, of the public meeting:

The local mayor.

A representative of the local school employee organization. (ex: SMMCTA or SEIU)

A representative of each parent organization at the school site, including the parent

teacher association and parent teacher clubs. (ex: PTA/ELA/Other)

A representative of each teacher organization at the school site.

A representative of the student body government. (ex: ASB)

All persons who have indicated they want to be notified.

(3) The school site council or school safety planning committee is encouraged to notify, in writing, the following persons and entities, if available, of the public meeting:

A representative of the local churches. (Discuss with SSC and give them the task to invite) Local civic leaders. (Discuss with SSC and give them the task to invite) Local business organizations (Discuss with SSC and give them the task to invite)

What is in the CSSP?

Comprehensive School Safety Plans are required under SB 719 & AB 115 and contains the following elements:

- Assessment of school crime committed on school campuses and at schoolrelated functions
- Child abuse reporting procedures
- Disaster procedures
- Suspension and expulsion policies
- Procedures to notify teachers of dangerous pupils
- Discrimination and harassment policies
- School wide dress code policies
- Procedures for safe ingress and egress
- Policies enacted to maintain a safe and orderly environment
- Rules and procedures on school discipline
- Hate crime reporting procedures

CSSP PROCESS/TIMELINE:

- Annual Update (Evaluate/Amend as needed)
- Begin with assessment of the current status of school crime
 - OLWEUS Survey
 - o -CHKS Survey
 - o -Office Referrals
 - -Additional surveys
- Update maps/student information
- Revise team members
- December 12, 2019: SSC Input
- Revise/Update information
- January 23, 2020 (TODAY): Present and allow for public opinions
- January 30, 2020: Deadline to submit to district
- February/March: School Board Approval









SECURITY EFFORTS 2019-2020

- Emergency/Disaster binder updated by administration (new campus map, evacuation routes, emergency tree, simplified language, one page cheat sheet, etc)
- Annual staff trainings (board policies, mandated reporter, targeted response, depression/suicide)
- School staff attended active shooter training with Lt. Jenn Seetoo
- School staff attended US Secret Service National Threat Assessment Enhancing School Safety training
- Meeting with POMS and HS parents around safety issues
- Working with district to install perimeter cameras and perimeter fencing
- Working with city/district to pursue a SRO
- Emergency drills (earthquake, fire, lock down, shelter in place)

SECURITY EFFORTS 2019-2020

- Adminstration met with Cpt. Vander Horck and Lt. Minster
- Administration met with Fire Captain
- Ongoing partnership with Juvenile Intervention Team/STAR Program
- District working with KBUU and Malibu Foundation to install emergency communication between Malibu and Santa Monica
- No Bully Meeting
- OLWEUS training
- Start with Hello Week
- Rules Assemblies with all students
- Continued implementation of Restorative Justice practices, more staff trained
- NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) presentations in all classrooms and at POMS

SECURITY EFFORTS 2019-2020

- Wellness Center Partnerships/Classroom presentations
- Revised pick up/drop off procedures
- Security Assessment performed by JRIC (Joint Regional Intelligence Center)
- Implementation of Raptor Visitor ID System
- Inventory of disaster supplies
- In the process of bringing back Parent Eyes
- Compiled list of trained students (i.e. lifeguards) to assist in disasters
- Twitter for immediate communication from principals

CSSP REVISIONS:

- Revised comprehensive safety plan purpose: student code of conduct, student expectations, activities implemented
- Revised Components of safety plan: names, roles, evacuation plans, locations
- Added info on safe ingress/egress: pick up/drop off, site access
- Updated suspension/expulsion data: 1.25%/0%

CSSP REVISIONS:

- Updated Emergency Contact lists
- Added Emergency maps
- Created clear Incident Command System: identified alternate team leads, alternate locations
- Added info on student with health/special needs
- Added information around air quality index and response



Takeaways from today:

- Our relationships with students and families
- Students are comfortable reporting to us when things are not normal
- We are safe schools and largely the inappropriate behavior is immature/silly vs mean/dangerous
