

## LINCOLN MIDDLE SCHOOL BLDG 500 RENOVATION PROJECT

### HISTORY

The Lincoln 500 building, located on the northwest corner of campus along Washington Street and 14<sup>th</sup> street, was constructed in the late 1950's. Lincoln Bldg. 500 was originally part of an expansion effort to support a large population boom resulting in rising enrollment in Santa Monica post-World War II. It has served as classrooms, laboratory space, and wood shop education for the campus and SMMUSD programs.

### WHAT WE ARE DOING

The original building structure to be revitalized by removing the exterior walls, interior walls, roofing systems, utilities, and exterior courtyard adjacent to the athletics field. The new building will be refreshed with a facade featuring a new storefront entry welcoming the students that can be viewed from 14<sup>th</sup> Street. A new communal courtyard area and highlighting the 8<sup>th</sup> grade hub housing new innovation labs, having state of the art facilities.

### WHAT TO KNOW

**Construction is scheduled to start June 13<sup>th</sup>** focusing on the demolition of the exterior/interior walls along with roofing and courtyard throughout the summer. The build back will succeed into the new school year.

Thank you all for your patience and understanding during the construction process. We understand demolition and construction produces noise and dust, which the Contractor will produce best work management practices for noise and dust control. The work hours will be during the allowable city of Santa Monica guidelines. Contractor holds weekly safety meetings to confirm that all workers are engaged in a safe workplace and safe school campus.
