Across the District, promised school improvement projects are underway, made possible by voter approval of Measure QS:



Improving school safety and security systems



Updating Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) facilities



Modernizing and replacing outdated learning centers at elementary and middle schools



Building new TK classrooms and improving learning spaces at elementary schools



Improvements Underway Across Santa Monica Schools

Projects Underway:

- Roosevelt Elementary: New early childhood building and library
- Grant Elementary School: Updated library and a new classroom building
- John Adams Middle School: New STEM building
- Lincoln Middle School: Modernization of classroom building—originally built more than 70 years ago-to house new 8th grade STEM classrooms and labs

Projects Breaking Ground Next Year:

- Franklin Elementary School: New early learning building and play field
- Michelle & Barack Obama Center for Inquiry & Exploration: Preschool modernization and special education program
- Santa Monica High: Student Services/Student Center Building, including new Black Box Theater
